- Successfully implemented projects on poverty alleviation as well as post-disaster recovery in China that had a value of more than US\$1 billion, assisting more than 30 million people, mostly in the remote central and western regions of the



After 2005

- China has become an increasingly significant donor to WFP's global activities, with over US\$97.5 million in funding from the Government of China as of October 2016, in support of WFP's operations around

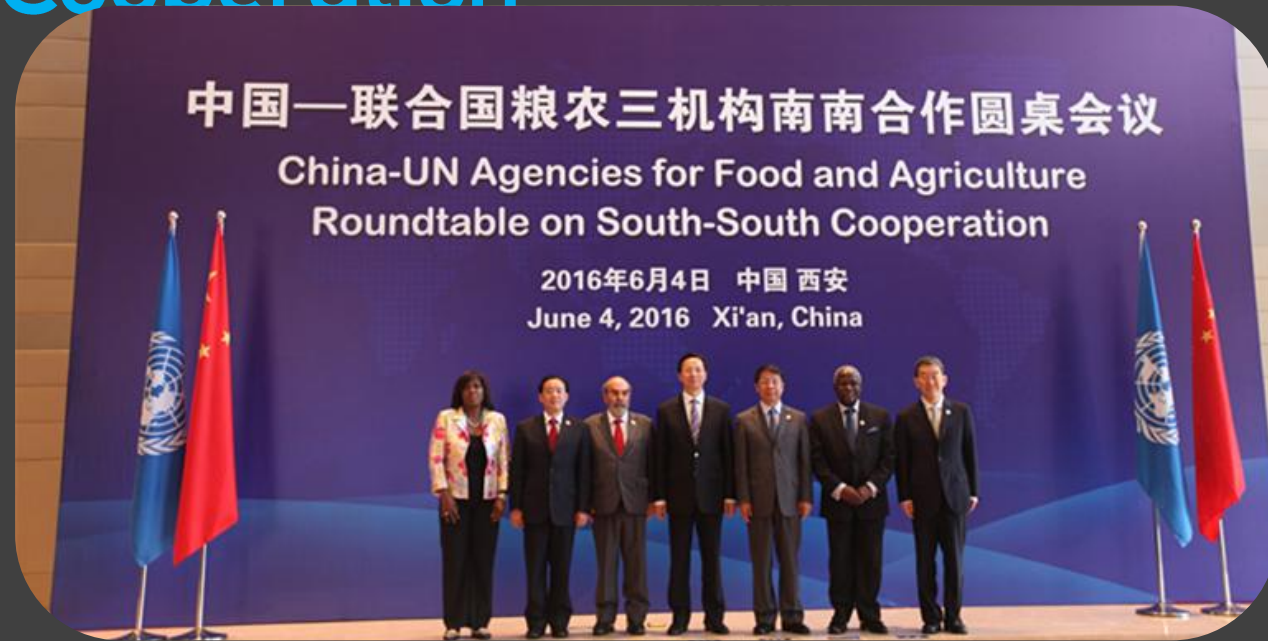
